Privacy Consent

What is this about?

The survey “Smells Like Ageism – How Age Shapes Belonging, Visibility, and Participation in Club Culture, Live Music, Raves, and Festivals” examines the role of age, age-related assumptions, and age-based exclusion in music and event contexts.

Participation takes about 15 minutes.

Voluntary participation

Participation is voluntary. You can stop taking the survey at any time without any disadvantages. Until you submit the questionnaire, you can end your participation by closing the browser window.

After submission, it is generally no longer possible to delete individual responses, as the survey data will be analyzed anonymously or without direct personal identification.

Data collected

The questionnaire asks for information on age, gender, city or region, connection to the scene, music genres, as well as personal assessments, experiences, and observations related to age.

Open-ended questions are optional. Please do not include full names of individual people or private places if this would make them clearly identifiable.

Use of the data

Responses will be treated confidentially, analyzed anonymously, and published only in summarized form. Individual open-ended responses may be quoted in anonymized form.

Use of Google Forms

The survey is conducted via Google Forms. Email addresses are not collected automatically. Participation is not limited to Google accounts.

If you would like to be contacted for an interview or informed about the results at the end of the survey, your email address should be collected through a separate contact form and used only for that purpose.
